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5. You were required to design four motifs to be used in a random pattern that contrasts with the portrait. Describe how you conceptualized the pattern contrasting with the person and analyze how successful your choice was.

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6. Describe the most successful aspects of your composition.

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7. What are your areas of growth?

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8. What skills or techniques did you learn that you can use for future projects?

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
